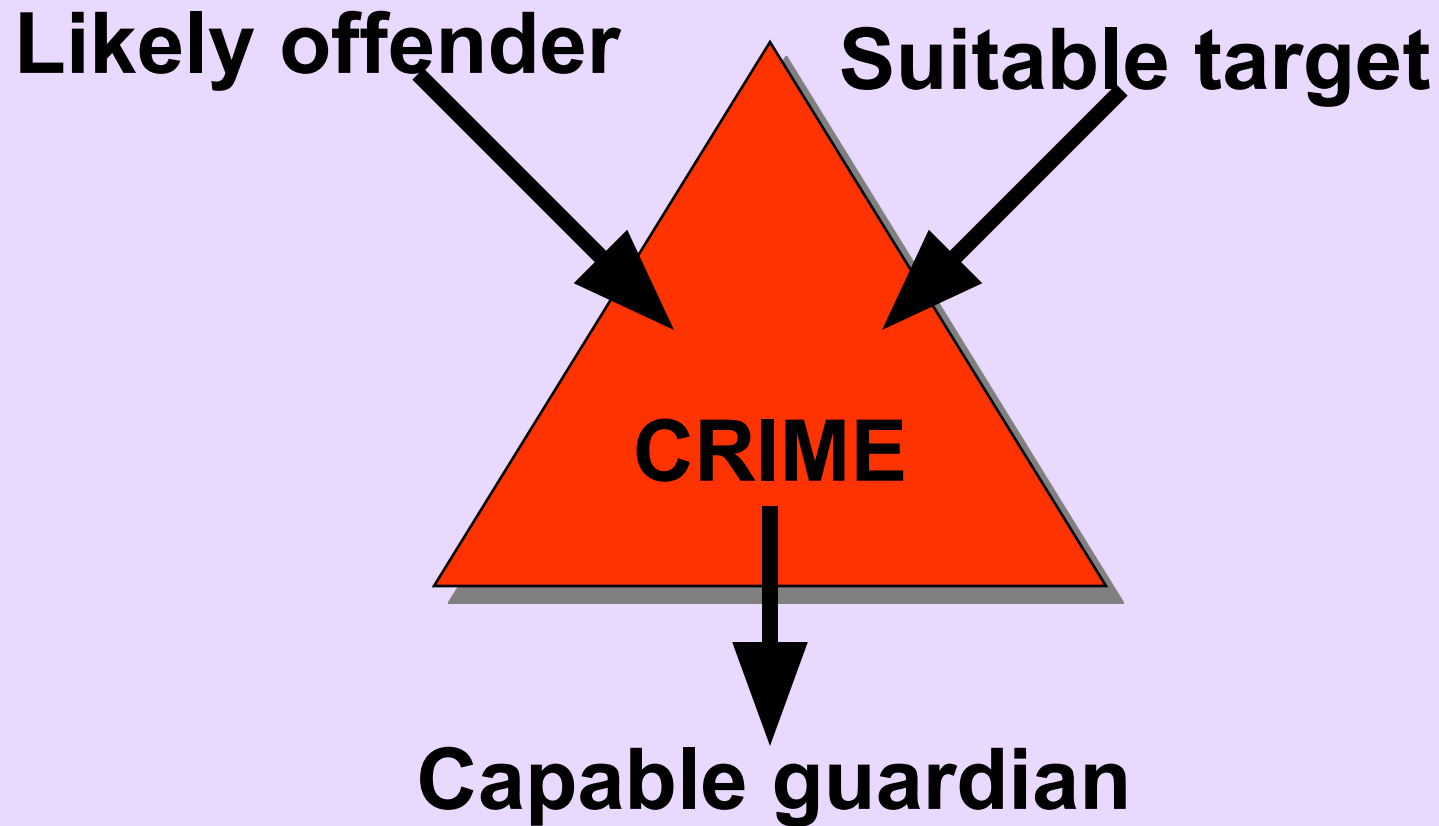

# Systematic crime reduction

Standard framework to:

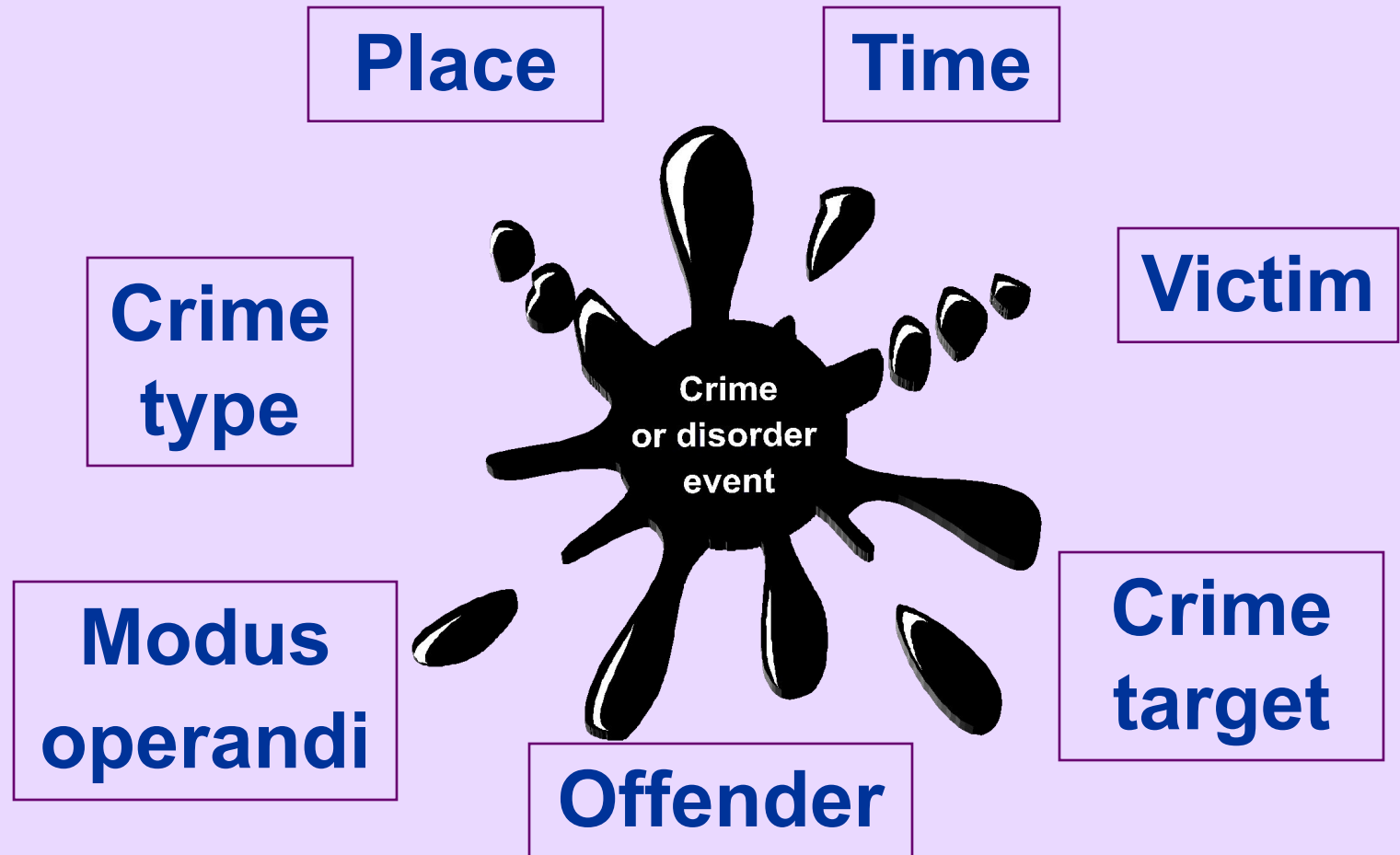
- Describe the crime problem
- Understand causes of crime problem
- Find out how to disrupt the causes of the crime problem (what works)

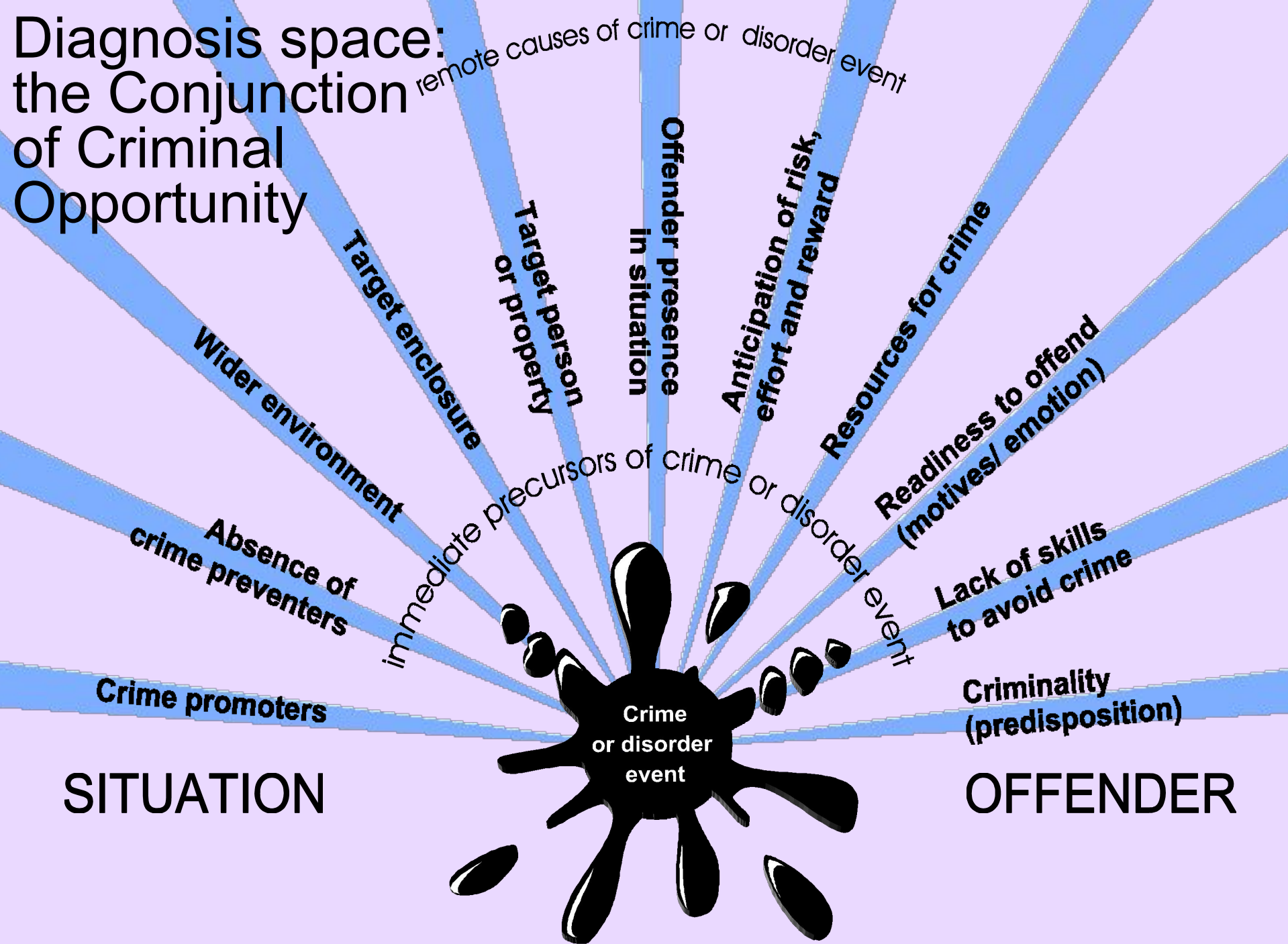


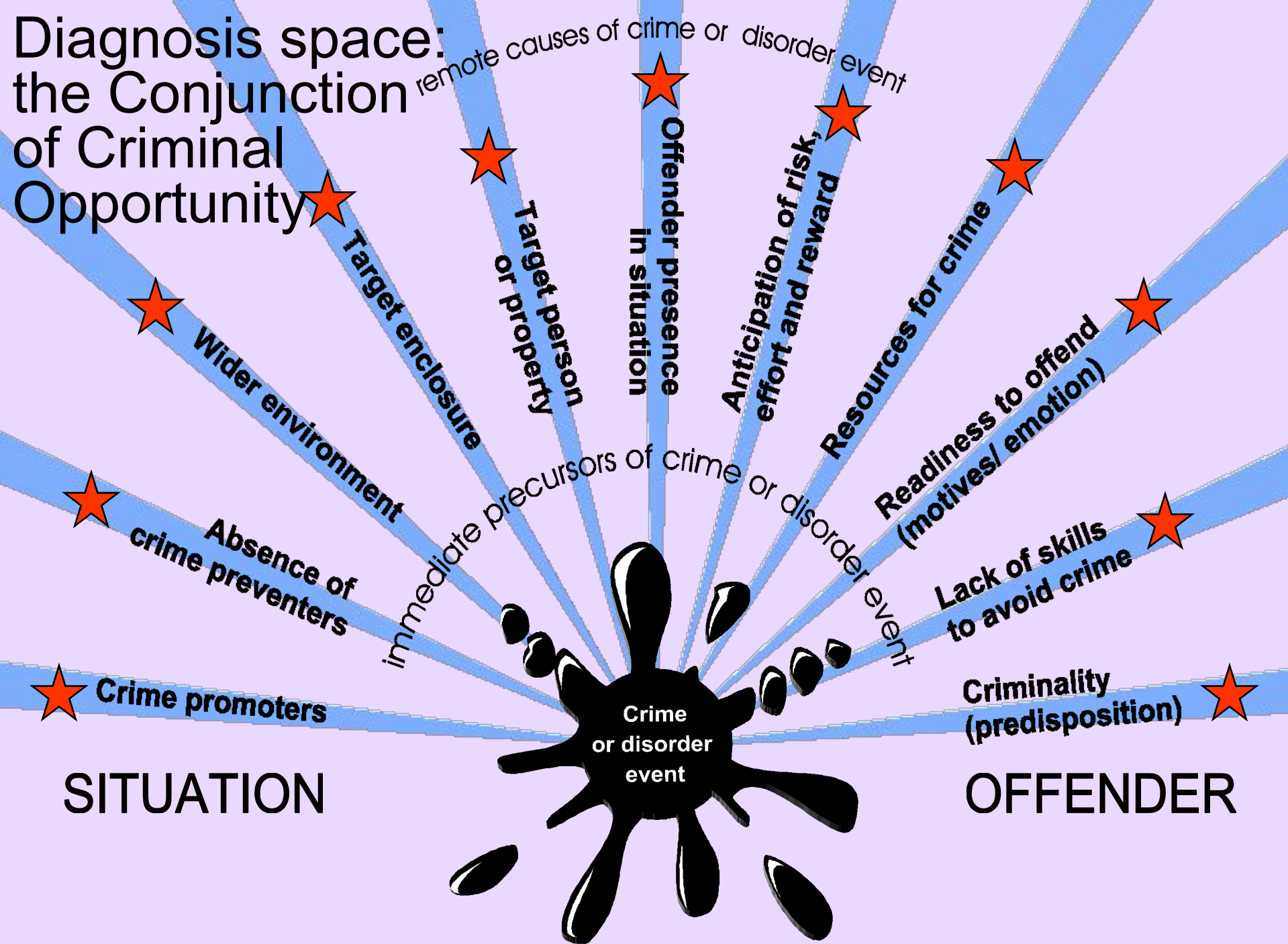

a map of symptoms**



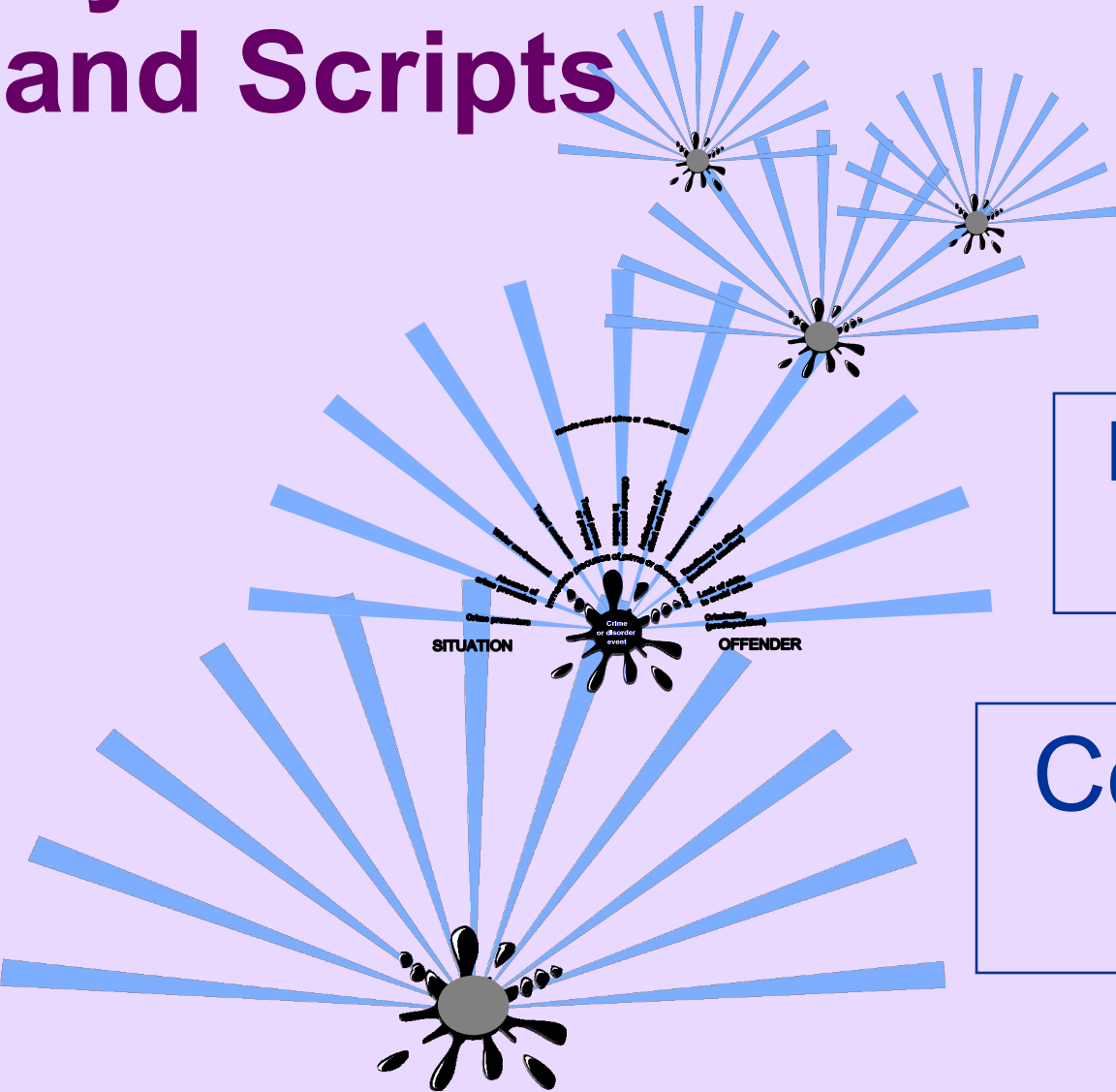

# **Strategic interventions: Beyond individual events/ transactions**

- **Level 1 - individual scene**
- **Level 2 - logistical structure of scenes**
- **Level 3 - day-to-day operation of a criminal enterprise**
- **Level 4 - wider structures**
  - **career of the criminal enterprise**
  - **niche**
  - **criminal network**
  - **markets for stolen or illegal goods**
- **Level 5 - whole ecosystem**



# Delivering preventive action (1)

## The basics\*:

- **Intervention** - in the causes of criminal events
- **Implementation** - of the preventive method to deliver the intervention
- **Involvement** - action at a distance - mobilising other agencies, institutions and individuals to implement, intervene, insert

# Delivering preventive action (2)

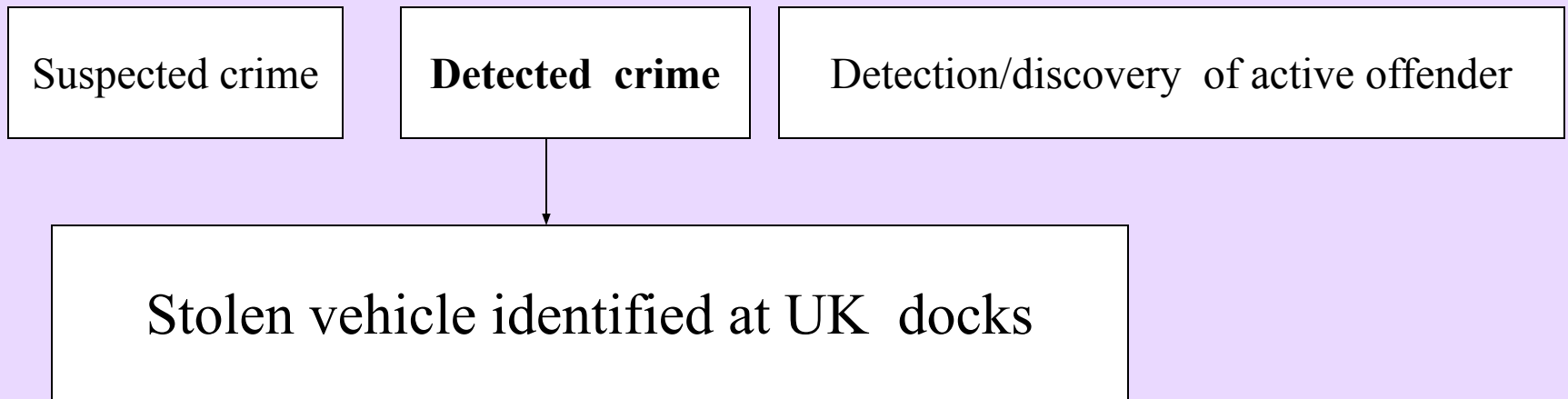
Involvement:

- Clarify the CR tasks **that need to be achieved**
- Locate the preventive agents
- Alert & Inform **them**
- Motivate **them**
  - Acceptance
  - Duty
  - Self-interest - incentives and sanctions
  - Regulations/ standards
- Empower **them** - **increase capacity through**
  - Supply of operational resources
  - Legal powers, competence (including CCO), and technical aids
- Direct them – laws, standards, regulations

# THE CONJUNCTION OF CRIMINAL OPPORTUNITY

## Ekblom's CCO Model: Diagnosis Space

**Criminal Aim** = *Find and steal an expensive car to sell it to make money*

### **Crime or disorder event:**

- Criminal conspiracy
- Forgery
- Making counterfeit documents
- Obtain credit card by deception
- Steal car - theft - obtaining goods by deception
- Receiver handles stolen goods
- Courier handles stolen goods
- Illegal entry into UK with a false passport
- Shipper - aiding and abetting a crime
- Handling stolen goods - courier 2
- Handling stolen goods - new “owner”

# Thinking about Crime Reduction - and Detection

## Immediate precursors of crime or disorder event\*

### Situation and Offenders

#### **SITUATION:**

- Crime Promoters
- Absence of Crime Preventers
- Wider Environment
- Target Enclosure
- Target Person or Property

#### **OFFENDER:**

- Criminality Predisposition
- Lack of Skills to Avoid crime
- Readiness to Offend
- Resources for Crime
- Anticipation of Risk/Effort/Reward
- Presence in Situation

- Organiser

### Organiser:

- Finances
- Leadership
- Connections- networking skills
- Business skills
- Distance from many scenes
- Capacity to implement violence
- Command of loyalty/fear/respect
- Legitimate cover?

**OFFENDER: RESOURCES FOR CRIME**

**Thief-hirer:**

- Driving ability
- Capacity to deceive
- Correct age/sex/appearance
- Acting ability
- Calmness
- British (if UK credit card)
- Reliable/trustworthy/punctual
- Courage
- Accessible (can be contacted)

**Forger:**

- Craft and technical skills/ training
- Access to raw materials and technology
- Secrecy
- Legitimate cover?
- Network connected
- Trustworthy/reliable
- Accessible

### CRIME

#### Receiver:

- Legitimate cover
- Finance
- Network connected
- Reliable/trustworthy
- Accessible
- Suitable garage space

#### Courier:

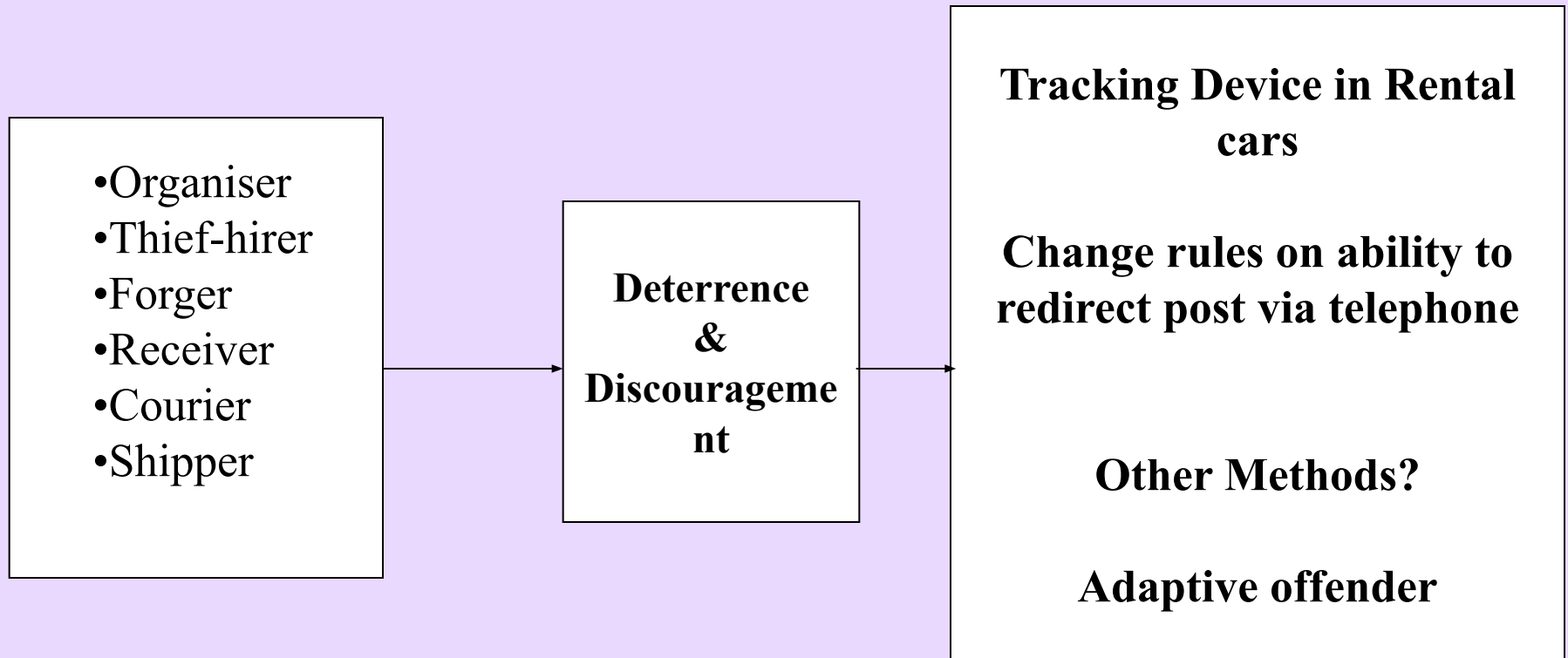
- Driving ability
- Free time/flexibility
- Availability
- Trustworthy
- Not network connected
- Suitable age/appearance
- Courage
- Vulnerable to threats of violence

#### Shipper:

- Employment with shipping Co.
- Workplace independence/privacy
- Courage
- Not networked
- Wiley
- Vulnerable to intimidation

# Facilitating the Preventive Process

LINKS CURRENT CRIME PROBLEM TO SOLUTIONS

## 1 IDENTIFICATION OF CRIME PROBLEM

- *systematic description of problem/*

## 2 DIAGNOSIS OF CAUSES OF CRIME PROBLEM

- *specification of operational objectives*

- *generic map of causes*

## 3 SELECTION OF SPECIFIC INTERVENTIONS, AND CREATION OF PRACTICAL OPERATIONAL SOLUTIONS

- *generic map of intervention mechanisms*

## 4 IMPLEMENTATION

- *clear specification of methods, schemes, packages*

## 5 EVALUATION/ RESULTS ANALYSIS AND ADJUSTMENT

- *framework for selecting and mobilising other agencies*

- *attribution of cause*

- *accumulation of 'what works' knowledge*

# Facilitating anticipation of crime

ANTICIPATES NEW CRIME PROBLEMS AND SOLUTIONS

- crime forecast
- crime impact assessment

# Facilitating reaction to crime

CID AND/OR FORENSIC INVESTIGATION

- Maps out immediate causes
- Means of systematically describing/  
classifying MOs
